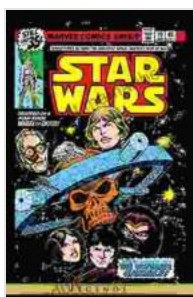


The Evolution of Star Wars: 1977, 1986, and 1999

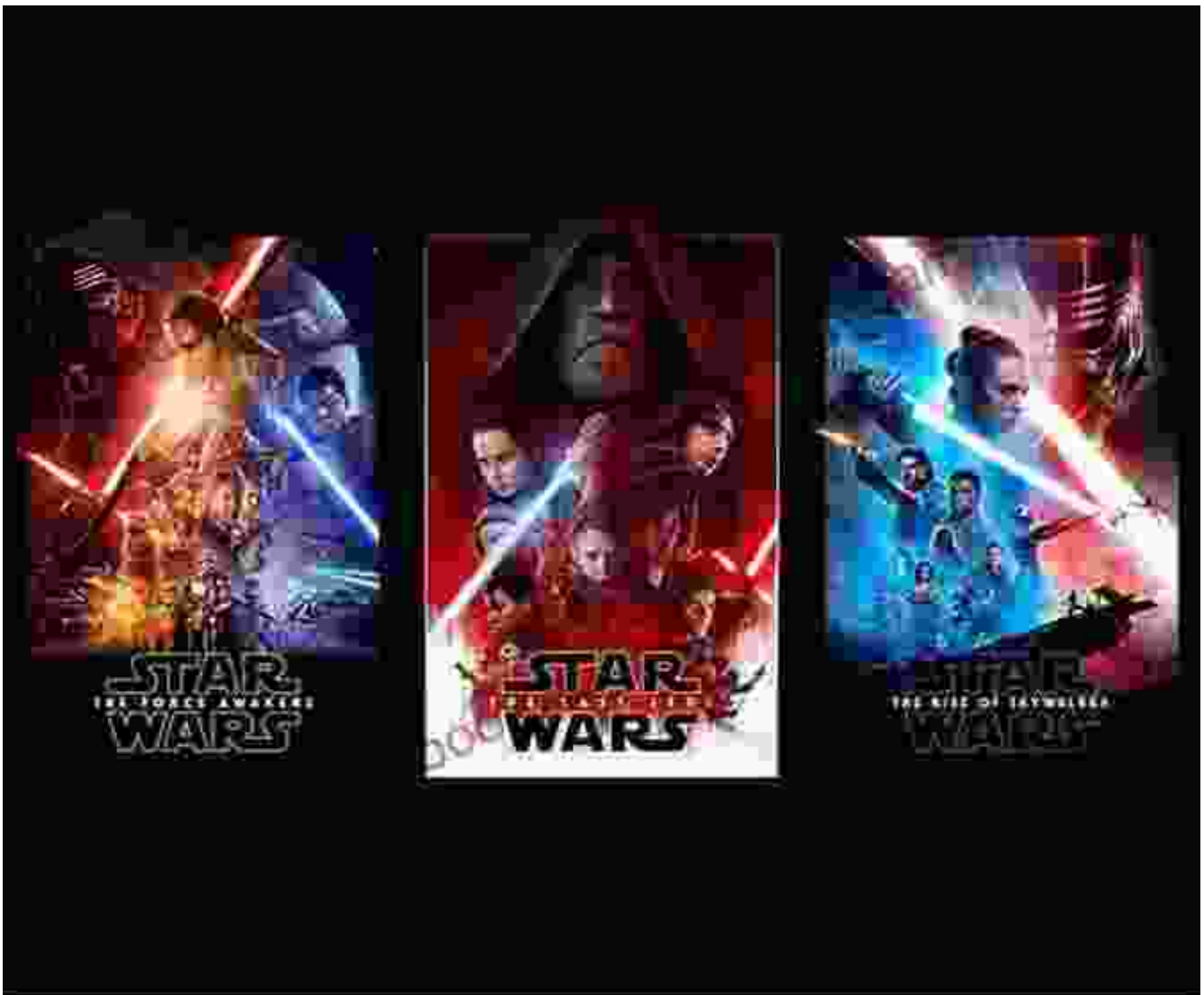

Leia Organa. The films also feature new characters such as BB-8, Captain Phasma, and Hux.

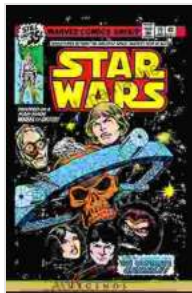
